### AFRICA

#### Zimbabwe

The Central Branch group in Zimbabwe is in the process of registering their organization at the official authorities in Zimbabwe.

### ARAB

#### Arab Region

Meeting of the international delegates of the pioneers in the Arab Region was held in Tunisia from 22 till 26 October 2019. Items on the agenda were the importance of the role and tasks of the international secretaries as well as the upcoming elections in the World Committee and focus on choosing candidates from the Arab region. They also discussed the efforts to complement the proposal of the Arabic language at the upcoming World Conference and focus on the millennium sustainable development goals.



### ASPAC

#### Asia Pacific Region

The AsPac Region committee will have their meeting on 28 February 2020 in Jakarta, Indonesia. The AsPac Regional Conference will be in 2021 in Penang, Malaysia. ### EUROPE

#### Europe Region



The 10th Europe Region conference was held in Bremen, Germany from 21 – 25 August 2019. One hundred and eighty (180) members were present. The 2nd Western Hemisphere Region Conference was held in New York, USA, from September 16 till 20, 2019.

There were 132 participants from 14 countries: Argentina, Aruba, Chile, Curacao, Haiti, Italy, Mexico, Netherlands, Portugal, Suriname, Trinidad & Tobago, Uruguay, USA and Venezuela.

### Brazil

Members of Guild 1, Joinville (Santa Catarina) of the Central Branch group "Asociacao Brasileira de Amigos, Escoteros e Bandeirantes" (ABAEB) started to work on a project.

Seeds of the Jussara Palm (*Euterpe Edulis*) plant have been transported and dispersed by paragliders who were carrying special bags to carry the seeds during the flight.

Another group of the Joinville Guild went to Monte Crista carrying the seeds in their backpacks and in total 60 kilos of Jussara palm seeds were dispersed.

In addition to seed dispersal, in joint efforts, more than 280 seedlings of native trees were planted.



### Canada

Leny Doelman, Central Branch Coordinator, was invited by Linda Bates from Canada (former World Committee member 2005 - 2011), for the opening ceremony of a Brotherhood Camporee that took place in Morrisburg, Ontario. Leny already travelled through the eastern part of the USA and Canada after the 2nd Western Hemisphere Conference. At that occasion seventeen (17) new members from Canada registered on the spot to become member of ISGF via Central Branch.



### Suriname

Together with the Alzheimer Foundation the Central Branch group PAVEURS from Suriname organized an event on June 29, 2019 for people with dementia, their partners, family members and friends.



### Trinidad & Tobago



Anand Rameshwar Singh started to become member of Central Branch in September 2016.
