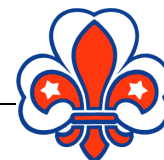


# 28<sup>th</sup> ISGF World Conference

# Report



28th ISGF-AISG  
World Conference  
October 9 to 14, 2017



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## Preamble

Bali or the 'Paradise Island' in Indonesia was the venue of the 28th ISGF World Conference that took place from 9<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup> October 2017 at Inna Bali Beach Hotel, Sanur.

Paradise Island, a name which echoes the harmony and the 'living together' of its inhabitants of diverse origins and beliefs as well as the national motto 'Unity in Diversity'. Most people live in villages and small towns divided into communities. Religion influences every aspect of the island's culture, from day-to-day village life to art, dance and music.

What better place for organizing a Conference on the theme 'hand in hand across the World' and highlighted by the Forum on 'Intercultural Dialogue'.

Two hundred and eighty (280) participants coming from 54 countries replied to the invitation of HIPPRADA, the NSGF of Indonesia, and gathered to enjoy moments of fraternal sharing but also of decision-making to drive ISGF towards an established position in the environmental, social and sustainable issues of the world. How can we make our world better without promoting tolerance, peace and cross-cultural bonds among peoples and nations?

To this question, the World Conference replied by adopting the ISGF Bali Declaration.



A conference, which was also lightened by the active presence of many scout volunteers coming from different places of Indonesia who were dedicated to facilitate the process of the event and to provide the necessary support to the participants. In our memories, their smiles and their kindness will remain as the expression of the unique and colourful Balinese culture which was also seen in the opening ceremony.

On 09<sup>th</sup> October, all participants were invited by the Host Committee for the Opening Ceremony.

The conference was officially opened by the Minister of Home Affairs of the Republic of Indonesia represented by the Director General of Politics and General Government, Major General (Ret.) Soedarmo. In his speech, Minister of Home Affairs, Tjahjo Kumolo, underlined the valuable and positive impact of Scouting on the betterment of the communities and its values for bringing a responsible citizenship at all levels. In this regard, he also offered his appreciation to ISGF for its contribution to further the scouting and guiding principles and for its valuable actions to support the youth organisations and the communities.

Prof. Haryono Suyono, Chair of the Hipprada, and Djokono Hardono, Chair of the Host Committee welcomed the participants to a Conference that had been blessed by Ida Pedande Gede Putera Telabah and was in the presence of Hanuman, the white monkey-God. For our greater pleasure, Mt Agung, a Balinese volcano, decided not to interfere in the smooth running of the event and not to erupt while participants were in Bali.... The ISGF World Conference was thus placed under good omens....



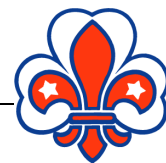

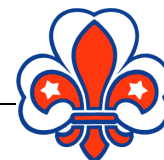

and temples, among which, the Uluwatu Temple where in its cliff-top amphitheatre, the most iconic art performance, the Kecak Fire Dance, was performed.

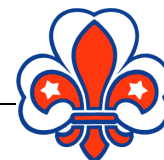

The Triennial report having been previously released to all ISGF Members ([triennial report- link](#)). Mida Rodrigues, Chairman of the ISGF WCom, reports on the tasks carried out between 2014 and 2017 focusing on three key activities:

### I. Our Kit.

Although the booklet 'Environment' is missing, this toolkit is a success of the ISGF WCom. It serves as an excellent overview of various thematic areas and it facilitates the implementation of activities in a context of adult scouting and guiding to better serve the Movement and the communities.

The presentation moves into the culminating phase when Virginia Bonasegale



- presents the book of ISGF projects, the last item in the collection, made in close cooperation with ISGF Members,

*The ISGF World Committee entrusted me with a mission and I never thought of not finalizing this booklet for being presented to the World Conference.*

*I would like to offer my deepest thanks to all NSGFs, the contact persons of the Central Branch groups, the International Ambassadors Guild, the Central-Europe Sub-Region, Verna, Leny and specially Cecile who, with a lot of patience, actively contributed to the production of this booklet.*

*You will find different many projects: from small, simple to challenging and important. The Adults scout and guide communities know how to carry out projects seriously and joyfully to support Scout and Guides organisations but also in favour of the environment and communities, where necessary, as you can see, at 360 degrees.*

*This is the best way to 'leave this world a little better' and this is the value that we want to offer to the adult scouting and guiding.*

*I would like to apologize for any imperfections you may find but I found it difficult to work on texts and photos coming from all over the world and we will correct them while working on the French version. Once more thank you to all of you, and now the ISGF has its own 'Our Kit', compiling eleven (11) booklets, which is our business card, a wonderful business card."*

### II. The global project in Haiti and the ISGF effective achievements:



- the full funding (US\$ 9,500) of the fence at the orphanage 'Enfant Haitien Mon Frère',
- some pieces of furniture provided to the school 'Carmen du Rocher' up to US\$8.070,
- a financial support available (€5,500) for the Girl Guides Association of Haiti to support the construction of the National Headquarters once the plans are approved.

The support does not end with the conclusion of this triennial period, fundraising continues during the WConf:

The ISGF WCom and the NSGF of Curacao, while participating in the World Market, will allot the funds raised to the Haiti project.

In addition, a quilt, handmade by some members the NSGF of Curacao, is raffled by Gisela Meije from the Netherlands. The action allowed to raise €418.

With the amounts collected, other supportive actions will be implemented in the following months in agreement with the new WCom.

- III. **Strengthened cooperation between the global and the regional levels.** During the last years communications and exchanges with the Regional entities was enhanced and the ISGF WCom, considering the challenges of each area, made a point to provide them with advice and guidance and with a grant (2,500 €/Region) to make the development more effective. In this connection, the five (5) Chairmen of the ISGF Regions are offered the floor to report on the activities carried out under their leadership.



**Africa Region, Henry Lukwele (Zambia)** who presents how the Region endeavoured to build solid foundations within the Region. Fundamental work was carried out to ensure:

- An accurate understanding of ISGF fields of activity and its processes;
- The development of the Region with guidance provided to targeted NSGFs;
- A better regional cohesion with the first Sub Regional gatherings in 2015 (Eastern, Southern) and the Africa Region Conference in 2017 (Burkina Faso) ;
- An effective governance with the active participation of the Chair in the WCom meeting (2016).

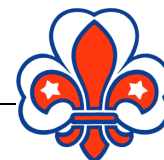

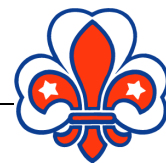
*"Dear members, dear delegates,*

*Thank you”.*

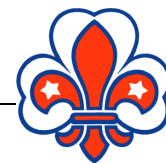

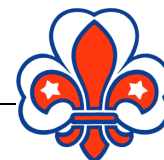
On 10<sup>th</sup> October, the candidates for ISGF membership take the floor for an action time focusing on the presentation of their respective organization and activities.

With these new Members, ISGF has now grown to 67 NSGFs and 39 Central Branches.



### Finances

Anthony Florizoone, ISGF treasurer, presents the accounts, which are in line with the adopted budget 2014-2017. The financial situation of ISGF remains precarious and it is still a core issue for the sustainability and the profile of ISGF.

The membership fees are the only income of the ISGF and without some personal initiatives and sponsoring of ISGF representatives, it could not have been possible to further tangible links, interactions and cooperation with members and partners at the local, national and international levels.

A budget which is limited to the annual fees and therefore dependent on the evolution of the ISGF's affiliation but, which is also affected by Members' arrears. The WCom members endeavoured to collect the fees during various events to facilitate the payments outside of the European area and this strategy made a positive impact on

the total amount of arrears.

The annual fee 2018-2020 will be increased by 4% as of 1<sup>st</sup> January 2018 in accordance with the Belgium Consumer Price index, which shows an inflation of 3.86%. In addition, a review of the evolution of the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) figures of ISGF country members based on the latest official list of the International Monetary Fund (2013) was done. ISGF Members subject to any change of category will be informed in due course and the new categorizing will enter into effect on 1<sup>st</sup> January 2018 as well.

### The International Development Funds, WCom policy recommendation

The ISGF World Committee, represented by Runar Bakke (Norway), reports on the utility and the serviceability of the J.S. **Wilson Fund and the Ceschi Müller Funds**, pursuant to the circular 09A . The World conference endorses the ISGF WCom policy recommendation. As a result, from now on, these funds are removed from the IDF structure and when ISGF makes the decision to offer grants, based on the original idea of these Funds, the relevant amounts will be taken from the International Development Fund.

### Constitutional amendments

Australia introduced late proposals for motions, after the constitutional deadline, for the cancellation of the free seat practice for WCom at World Conference (WConf). The submitted alternatives involve the allocation of the costs of the ISGF World Committee participation in ISGF World Conferences to the ISGF WCom operational budget.

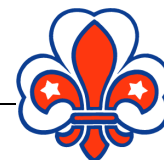
In compliance with the Bye-Law 1.3 iii, the head of the Australian delegation, Greg Davies, presents the rationale for the urgency to the WConf, which is based on a question of time in order not to put off the decision to 2020 and its application to 2023 if carried. The WConf rejects the matter of urgency and decides not to discuss them.

In a continuous process of easing the ISGF development, the WConf amends the criteria for being granted ISGF Full or Associate membership by adding a provision stating a ratio demography / minimum number of members required for the country candidate when the population is less than 600,000.

The proposal for reducing the number of ISGF World Committee members from eight (8) to six (6) with immediate effect is adopted while the one with reference to the reduction of the term of office to three (3) years, renewable once, is rejected.

This results in the election of three (3) members for a six (6) years mandate (2017-2023).





### The ISGF World Committee (WCom)



Six (6) candidates were standing for election to the ISGF World Committee. On 10<sup>th</sup> October, the candidates have the opportunity to introduce themselves to the World Conference focusing on their background, their vision and their objectives. Then, each candidate is given the symbolic yellow scarf, sign of their candidacy to the WCom.

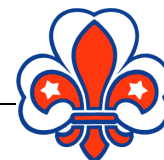

### 29<sup>th</sup> ISGF World Conference 2020

Two (2) countries applied to host the 29<sup>th</sup> ISGF World Conference in 2020. Ghana withdrew its application at the last minute. Spain introduces its bid ([link to the presentation](#)) and for a matter of legitimacy, the WConf proceeds with the election of the host country.

The World Conference will take place in Madrid.



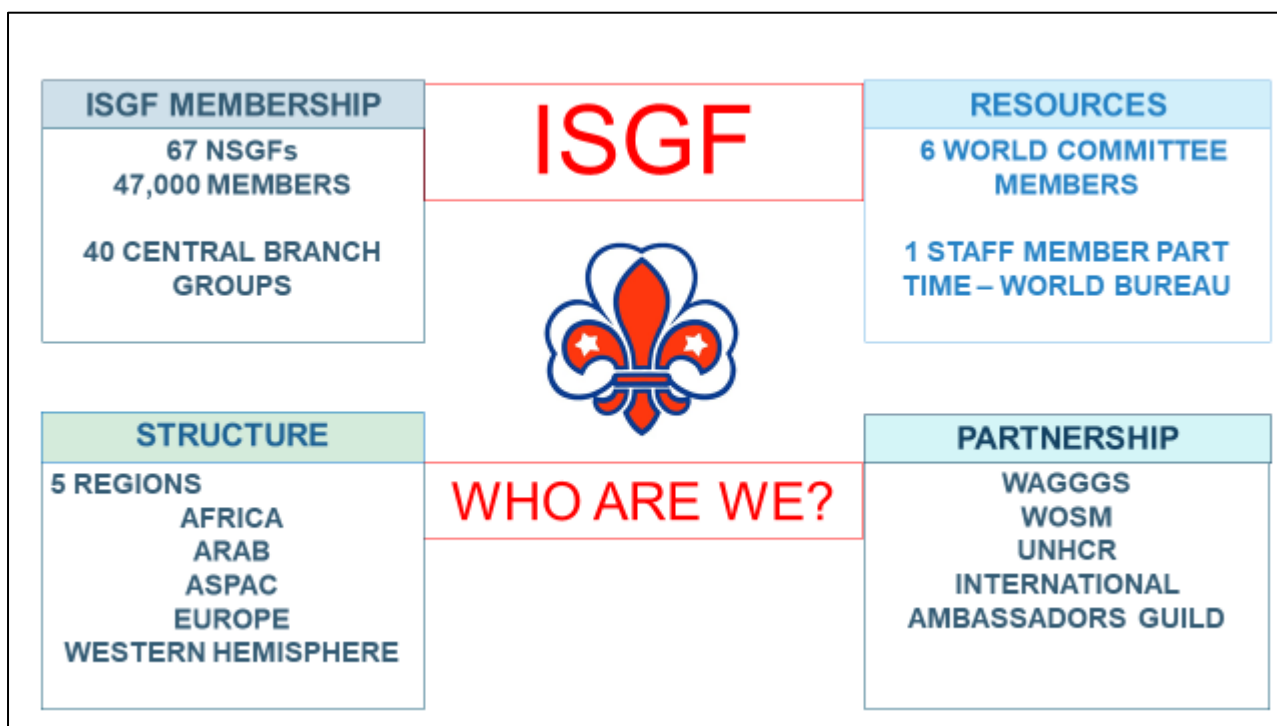


Before the workshops take place, the ISGF World Committee deems it important to remind the World Conference of the prevailing situation of the ISGF underlining the lack of resources, the ISGF challenges in terms of personnel and finances, and the ISGF operating mode based on goodwill and volunteering. It aims at developing understanding and wisdom of the participants to come up with a realistic and feasible plan which will be based on development (partners, projects, membership, human resources), visibility (rebrand, promote and market the fellowships to work with other partners to be recognized globally), Environment and peace and strengthening and furthering the Regions.



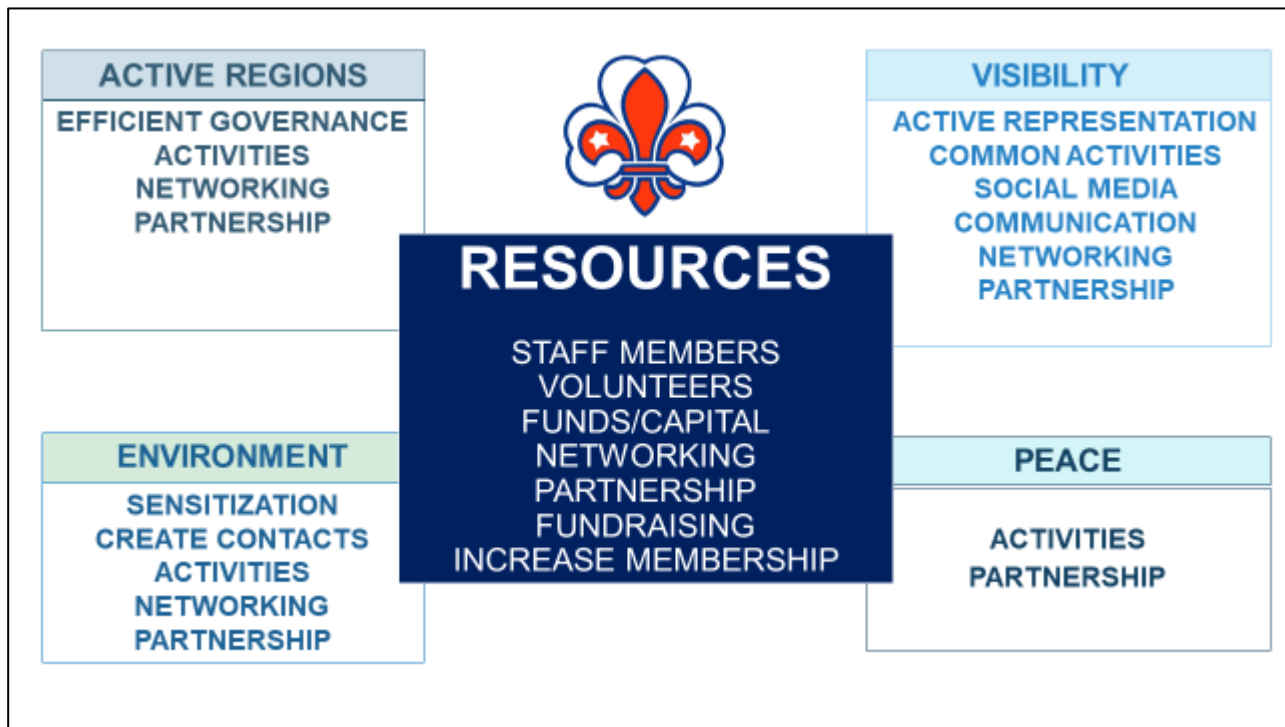
In parallel to this presentation, Anne Hastrup (Denmark), representative of the Nordic Baltic Sub-Region, introduces the NBSR recommendation. While referring to the 26<sup>th</sup> ISGF World Conference and its theme 'Our Common Goods, Water, Earth, Air' and the then recommendation put forward, she reminds everyone that since the inception of Scouting, nature and life in the outdoors have been considered as the ideal framework for Scout activities. She therefore appeals to the World Conference to develop an Action Plan 2017-2020 with the theme of environmental sustainability.

In accordance with the outcomes of the workshops, the following Action Plan 2018-2020 is presented to the WConf by Runar Bakke and Mathius Lukwago, and approved:




**Who ISGF is, how ISGF is structured, who its partners are, and what its resources are.**





This slide presents the strategic orientations with key points however without the development of ISGF resources, the implementation of the Action Plan will be significantly hampered. The question of the ISGF resources is a joint responsibility of all levels of ISGF. Therefore, the first step is to focus on the recruitment of volunteers and new members, opening new opportunities of partnership and fundraising, extending ISGF networking for improving ISGF actions and position afterwards.

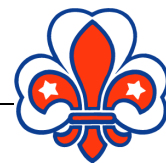

Mr. Abdullah Rasheed, Consultant at the office of the WOSM Secretary General and acting as the WOSM representative, presents the outcomes of the lately WOSM World Conference but also, the orientations and the strategic working methods adopted by WOSM to contribute to the WOSM Vision 2023 and to implement the triennial plan 2017-2020. Reference is made to the ISGF participations in WOSM events and the cordial relationship between ISGF and WOSM.

### Key updates

- The year started with a new Secretary General, Ahmad Alhendawi, Jordan, Former Special Youth Advisor to UN Secretary General
- A new Global Chief of Staff, Ms. Noha Shawky from Egypt
- A successful 2nd World Educational Congress, in Kanderstag in May 2017, World Scout Moot, in Iceland in July 2017, World Scout Youth Forum and Scout Conference in Baku, Azerbaijan (August 2017)

### Key updates

- A new World Scout Committee and a new Chairman – Mr. Craig Turple, United Kingdom and they just concluded the 3 day Induction Training of the new Committee in Nyeri, Kenya and the 1st full business meeting will be in Kuala Lumpur in early November 2017
- With new NSO's admission, WOSM current membership is 169 and membership grown to over 50 million
- Biggest Scouting event JOTA-JOTI in the coming third week end of this October

### Conference in Baku

- The Conference adopted the 2017-2020 Triennial Plan, which will boost the efforts to achieve WOSM Vision 2023. The Vision was adopted in 2014 in Slovenia
- More than 1,100 participants attended the conference, representing 160 National Scout Organizations from all six WOSM Regions, Making it the largest in the history of World Scouting.

Mrs Bjorg Walstad (Norway), Chairman of IAG, describes the guild and the support provided to Scouting and Guiding during the last years.

### **“An Ambassador.**

*To be an Ambassador in the political life is a very important position to have, undertake.*

*If you represent a nation you should do your utmost to advertise for your wonderful homeland, secure good relations between countries, advertise for tourism, culture and trade and be a good link to those who are living abroad.*

*And of course you would have the opportunity to take part in more glorious events Together with ambassadors from other countries. But before that you should have a special training to do a good job.*

*To be an ambassador in the International Ambassador Guild is quite different. There are no glorious events except from the small party we have at every conference.*

*What about training?*

*I think most of us here have a lot of good experiences from the period we spend in scouting and guiding. Step by step we have realized the meaning of Baden Powell’s vision for young and adult. We have all been scouts or guides and are still in our minds. And we are ambassadors for the scout and guide spirit.*

*Twenty years ago in 1998, some members of ISGF from different nationalities got the idea to start the International Ambassadors Guild. The idea was to raise money for a fund that could be used for actively support scout and guide activities, projects planned and run by the scouts and guide themselves.*

*IAG provides additional financial support to Guiding and Scouting projects worldwide in the fields of education, community permanent development. Thus, IAG provides adult with an opportunity to do an extra Good Turn in promoting Guiding and Scouting.*

*For some years, IAG kept on saving money in order to consolidate its funds and later on use the interests for scouting and guiding support.*

*In 2012, we changed this policy and decided to start again the annual support to projects, projects already planned and partly founded by guide and scout associations.*

*Since then we have supported 3 to 4 projects every year. Some of them, the small one, have got full funding, and sometimes we help to boost bigger projects. As we did on Ivory Coast in Bosnia Herzegovina, in Malawi and Cyprus.*

*Let me give you some examples.*



*Pigeon Park scout center near Nyeri wanted in 2015 to build a small hall for indoor activities so that they could have trainings even during a period of rain. The Ambassadors Guild supported the first step of the project. Later on the Norwegian scout and guide fellowship decided to follow up. Last spring the building was finished, except for some furniture, tables and chairs. Our last support to them in 2017 was used for*

*that. Thus a national Fellowship and the Ambassadors guild worked on the same project with a very good result. Today there are many activities in the park and scouts and guides have got an excellent place to meet for training and develop friendship. It also serves as a center for the local community.*







*This summer a local scout and guide fellowship in Germany invited scouts and leaders from Hungary to take part in a national camp in Brandenburg and meet German Scouts at the "Obermeierhof". One of the objectives was also to raise their awareness of ISGF and how adult can contribute to Scouting and guiding.*

*The Girl Guides in Lebanon is working on a project to help improve the relations between the refugees living in refugee camps, most of them young families from Syria, and their host communities by inviting them to take part in local activities outside the camp. For me this is scouting and guiding put into practice. The Lebanese girl guides have got funding for the first step of their project a training courses for leaders responsible for the subject.*

*I will like to share with you some words from one of the reports we had this spring. It was send us from a group of guides and their leaders, all from Kinyago in the slum of Pumwani, Nairobi. They had got funding for a camp at Pigeon Park in February this year.*

*"During this camp we learned to work in a Patrol with a sixer as leader together with the grown up leaders. That as Scouts and Guides we are millions around the world- with the same Law and Promise, the same Salute the same badges, we all have scarf.*

*We also experienced that although most of us from Kinyago really live poorly and hardly have enough food as we only eat once a day- we just are scouts together with the others, and we even felt sometimes we knew MORE than the other scouts/guides.*

*We all wore the same uniform- you could not tell who lived poorly without enough food- and who were middle-class.*

*For most of us this was the first time OUT OF the slum-home without my mama or my guardian, with enough clean water to drink, with three meals a day, special treat with fruits twice a day – and lots of program- and everything so CLEAN and Green- so beautiful- we will never ever forget such an experience and hope to get a chance to go another year.!!*

*THANK YOU FOR MAKING IT POSSIBLE FOR US."*

*This was a glimpse of what we are doing*

*We could do more if we had more members. There are two categories of membership. You could be a life member by paying 1000 Euro once and for all or an ordinary member paying an annual subscription of 100 euro per year. If you choose the second option, you remain in this category as long as you pay an annual fee.*

*The annual fee from 15 members would cover the cost for the wonderful experience for the girls from Kinyago in Pigeon Park I just told you about.*

*All the money we get from our members is spent on projects.*

Ana Maria Volpe, International Secretary of the MASCI:

*“Today the theme of the World Conference is very important because we are experiencing an epochal phenomenon, on such scale since man exists, involving all continents:*

***THE IMMIGRATION,***

*Which sometimes carries with it problems of violence, exploitation and illegality.*

*But overall, the immigration is a unique meeting opportunity of human and social growth and to share principles of justice, peace, and human rights amongst everybody.*

*We, ‘Brother Scouts’, feel more and more called by article 4 of our law that declaims:*

*‘The Guide and the scout are friends of all brothers and sisters of any other Guide and Scout.’*

*For this reason, there is a need for synergy between all countries and the dialogue and confrontation with whom is different from us to become a promoter of ‘UNIVERSAL BOTHERHOOD’.*

The MASCI became the bearer of a [popular petition \(link\)](#) to be presented to the Italian Parliament, the European Parliament and other public institutions so that they can use tools and procedures to avoid repeating the massacres as they have been in these years and to make their stay as emigrants more dignified in Italy.

They already collected more than 33,000 signatures and on 21<sup>st</sup> October 2016, they delivered the petition to the Italian Parliament. On 08<sup>th</sup> November 2016, the petition was handed over to the chamber’s Constitutional Affairs Commission.

The ISGF World Committee launches a new project carried out in cooperation with UNHCR in Uganda in favour of the South Sudanese refugees in Uganda. The ISGF aims at providing 1,000 families with an emergency shelter and an appeal is made to ISGF members for their contribution. The WConf welcomes the project.

**THE NEED**

Among the 1.5 million of refugees who fled from South Sudan, Uganda received tens of thousands of them fleeing the propagation of violent fights.

Imvepi is a refugee settlement found in North-West Uganda, close to Ngurua and Mvepi, at an altitude of 730 metres. It is expected around 1,000 to 5,000 refugee arrive in Uganda from Southern Sudan each day. Very soon the number will reach the million people.

Mr. Anak Agung Ngurah Bagus Sudharsana, assistant to the Denpasar Mayor and Head of Tourism of Denpasar, presents the Balinese public infrastructure facilities and the living model of the island with the local government actions to ensure and to better the harmony of life within the various communities, fostering on the intercultural dialogue, the respect and the enhancement of the freedom of religions. A lecture, which underpins the forum on the intercultural dialogue with figures, concrete examples and facts.

#### Forum on the Intercultural dialogue

The program of the ISGF World Conference included a "Forum on the Intercultural Dialogue", under the coordination of Wahid Labidi, Vice Chair of the ISGF World Committee.

In the first plenary session, Wahid presents the concept of the forum and various interventions taking place:

Then four (4) working groups (two in English, one in French and one in Arabic) discussed the subject on the basis of the discussion themes proposed by the coordinator and distributed to the groups during two (2) workshops. The discussion themes were close to the document that was distributed in the conference documents before this one, namely:

- The role of NSGFs in promoting dialogue within and between cultures, ethnics and religions.
- The identification of good practices exploring social, education, cultural-based approaches to prevent violent extremism and the establishment of a network, ways of cooperation with other stakeholders.

The discussions within these groups were the subject of a report including the ideas that the ISGF and its members might have in the field of intercultural dialogue. On the basis of the 4 reports provided by the facilitators, Solange Lopez (Curacao), Jean François and Martine Levy (France), and Prof. Abdullah Alfahad (Saudi Arabia), a small drafting group lead by Maitre Akram Zribi (Tunisia), the General Rapporteur, established a synthesis.

This synthesis was presented visually to the plenary, which approved the outline and made some remarks that were taken into account in the final version of the "Bali Declaration".



"We, the participants in the 28<sup>th</sup> Conference of the International Scout and Guide Fellowship (ISGF) gathered in Bali, Indonesia, 9 to 13 October 2017,

- ☀ Considering the difficult relations between individuals, cultures and convictions all over the world,
- ☀ Considering the importance to strive for betterment and peace in a world plagued by war and terrorism.
- ☀ Considering the necessity to build a better society, in which the values of love, respect, tolerance, and peace are widely spread and shared.
- ☀ Considering the importance of encouraging dialogue and communication between different communities, and prohibiting discrimination based on race, gender, language, or religion.
- ☀ Considering the need to develop a sense of virtue and righteousness in everyone, through various programs and encourage a sense of responsibility towards one's community and the society in general, in particular through formal, informal and non-formal education of young ones.
  
- ☀ Declare that the following principles should be the basis for any action:
  - 1-maintain ongoing cultural dialogue that serves as a safe bridge between cultures, exchange experiences and uphold the common values that unite humanity.
  - 2- Respect others' cultural values and cherish cultural diversity as a mean to broaden everyone's horizon.
  - 3 - Use modern methods for cultural exchange programs, dialogue and joint social projects in which people from different cultures participate and aspire to a common goal.
  - 4- Encourage politicians, law-makers and other stake-holders to adopt policies that reflect the universal values of human rights as a mean to bring us together and to combat hate and intolerance.
  - 5 –Invest in national and international campaigns to promote a culture of peace and open dialogue, in particular among youth to help them in becoming active members in their societies.
  
- ☀ Recommend that communities and in particular NSGF's
  - 1 Celebrate the International Day of Tolerance, starting in 2018 (16<sup>th</sup> November).
  - 2 Take part in the work of NGO's within UNESCO and other international and regional bodies using the documents they will receive.
  - 3 Take part in social actions: organise activities with prisoners and young offenders, assist vulnerable people such as children of the streets, refugees, families in need etc. and take contacts with associations working in these fields.
  - 4 Organise activities or participate in activities which facilitate contacts: sport, marches, cooking, dance, music, host family exchanges etc.
  - 5 take contacts with known personalities who could accompany the actions.
  - 6 take contact with politicians, law-makers and other stake-holders to let them know a Scout and Guide (young and adult) point of view
  
- ✚ Ask ISGF to
  - 1 encourage twinning s between local fellowships
  - 2 set up programmes such as the Scout and Guide Spirit Flame, "Messengers of peace" of WOSM, "Free being me" of WAGGGS.
  - 3 find a volunteer or group of volunteers competent in crowdfunding
  - 4 promote a systematic evaluation of experiences of participants during regional and sub-regional meetings.

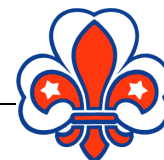

#### **International Secretary (IS)**

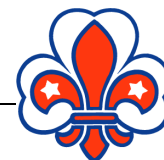

*I'm sure the project with the HCR in Uganda with the support of us all will also be a big contribution to benefit the refugees in the world.*

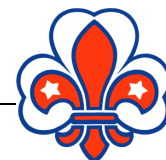
*Many things have been done, but many more are still to do.*

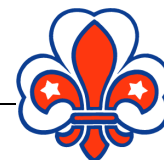
*Our key areas of focus will be, visibility, Environment, peace partnership and Building our resource base and strengthening regional committees for better service delivery.*
