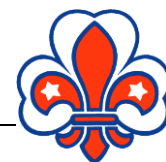

○ Lighting candle ceremony



In many parts of the world, it is common to light a candle in remembrance of those who have died. Only in the Basque Country, this kind of tradition has taken its own special form. The Argizaiola, literally translated as candle-board (from argizari — candle or wax and ohol — board), is a wooden board around which a thin wax candle is wrapped. The Argizaiola was placed on the family tomb and lit, on all Sundays but particularly on All Saints Day, to give a light to show souls the way and chase away the darkness. The meaning of his complicated drawings has not been discovered.

- Australia asked if it was a typing error on the auditors signed document where it says 2018 and not 2017; Anthony explained that it was a typing error, and it will be corrected;
- Senegal intervened; Malaysia asked how the projects are chosen / eligible; Anthony explained that it is the World Committee that chooses;
- Senegal asked if the documents are trustworthy; Elin, the World Chairman, took the floor and reassured the audience of the total trust of the WCom in the Treasurer;
- Australia asks about certain funds;
- Angola asked about the funds of the Uganda project;
- Algeria asked about why projects were not done in the last couple of years; Elin explained it was an executive decision not to give the money to any projects; the money is there, and countries can send their projects for approval/acceptance;



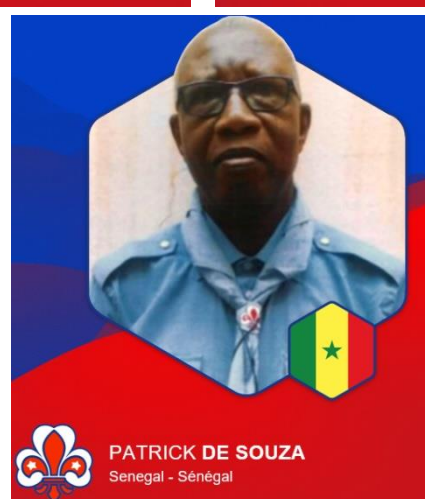
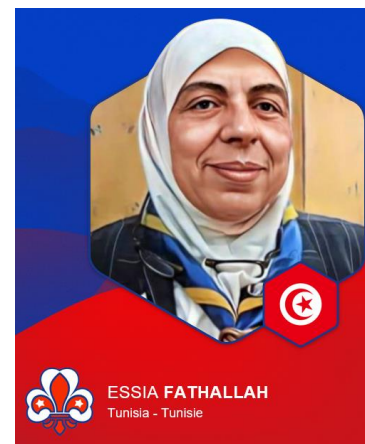
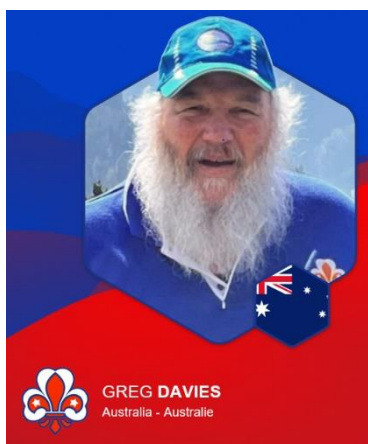

- ISGF Constitution Amendments and motions

- Australia presents its motion; Anthony explains how the costs are;
 - Voting: yes 115, no 30, abstains 42
- Spain amendment: explains the use of AI for the translations, there is no use to create more costs;
 - Elin read the WCom recommendation: *At this time the proposal is a positive way forward as it is recognised as a long-term ambition of ISGF to adopt Spanish as an official language of ISGF, however this would result in a large financial commitment. At the present time a requirement for employed ISGF staff is to be fluent in both English and French as a large proportion of time is used to ensure that documents are accurately translated. All volunteers within the World Committee and associated teams are required to be able speak and work well in English and /or French. To employ a member of staff who can support the Bureau's work in Spanish would incur considerable expense and result in a large increase in membership fees. Unless the Spanish speaking NSGF's have a plan to provide sponsorship for such a person.*
 - Australia agreed with the WCom regarding the importance of the WB only with EN/FR;
 - Spanish speaking countries can help the WB with translators;
 - Egypt congratulated Spain for this amendment but would like that the next language to be approved is Arabic;
 - Saudi Arabia also expressed the same will;
 - Australia puts out the hypothesis if the Cervantes team “ends” in the future, will that intervene with anything?
 - Spain explained by Helena, President of AISG Spain, that the Cervantes project already exists for some years and because the Spanish speaking countries present in our ISGF are so many, that the Spanish language should be part of it as it does in WOSM;
 - The Netherlands said that a 3rd language should not exist; if a 3rd language is accepted, which one shall be the next?
 - Libya gave their input saying that for translating documents is ok, but what about when we have events, can translation be done that easily?
 - France asked Leny, ISGF website Content manager, about her opinion; Leny explained that she will have 3 times the work; the SG said that although the translation in paper is done by Cervantes, there has to be a text revision by the WB/WCom;
 - Portugal gave a testimony about the importance of one speaking the language of the country who welcomes you;
 - Voting of the sub-amendment: yes: 128, no:49; abstention: 40; DEFEATED;

Voting of the amendment: yes:75, no:88; abstention: 36 – DEFEATED (needed 133 votes)
- UK Amendment to the Rules of Procedure
 - France did question-this motion; how did the UK get the secondment? It was Seconded by Denmark. Voting yes:193, no:4, abstention: 21



- Elections for the WCom - voting
 - Ballots delivered and explained again how to vote
 - Roll call – Haiti was not in the room
 - It was read the 6 g), voting process
 - Tellers get all the papers – out of the room to count the votes;
 - Qatar asked to speak – does not agree with the voting process and does not think there should be a secret ballot.
 - Essia Fathallah (Tunisia), Greg Davies (Australia) and Sue Page (UK) are elected.

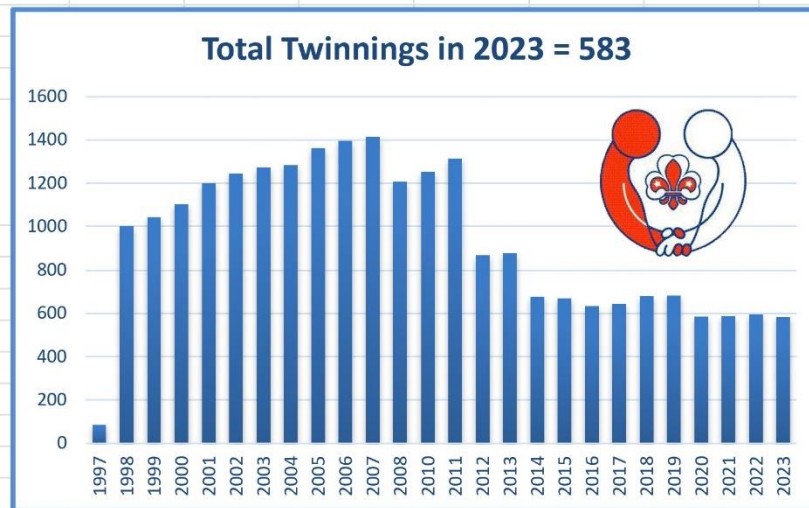

- Twinning together with a request from 9 members of NSGF Mexico who are seeking a member in the world to twin with.

- Election of host country to 2027:
 - Malaysia withdraws its candidature
 - Saudi Arabia withdraw its candidature
 - Senegal is the only candidate; because a lot of countries approached and said they would not vote in Senegal for the next conference, the WCom decided to defer this situation; for that, it was communicated that the countries can send their applications to host the 2027 Conference until March 15th, 2025. (6 months from the conference in Granada).
 - Tunisia intervened asking that the future hosting country will provide better help for the visas issue; some other comments in the room, explained that this is a common situation, due to the situation that who decides is the governments and not the hosting country;
 - Roll call to vote for this new situation: Kuwait, Nepal, Argentina, Brazil not present (not voting)
 - Voting for the deferral for the 2027 host conference: yes:191 – APPROVED
 - Suriname informed that they have lost their voting cards; the SG informed that without them they cannot vote;
- Action Time: Suriname, Chile, Portugal, Slovakia, Spain Libya, Trinidad & Tobago

- Action Plan 2024 – 2027 after the new WCom will update/change



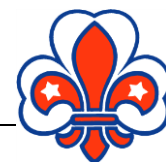
- Questions (given the floor to participants):

 - France: refers that it is the first time the WCom has members from all regions where ISGF is present;
 - Italy: makes a remark for the Action Plan: Peace, WAGGGS and WOSM
 - Voting of ACTION PLAN: yes: vast majority;

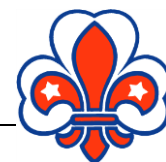

Resolution 7: Members

The Conference,
Having heard the report from the World Committee and the presentation of NSGF's candidates accepts Burundi as full member and Bolivia as associate member.
Taiwan is also a candidate. But there are still questions on their documents. The Conference accepted that the World Committee will receive Taiwan as a member once the questions on their documents have received satisfactory answers.

Resolution 8: Amendments to the Constitution and bye-law and motions

The Conference,
Having discussed the motions presented to the Conference decides as follows:



8.1 Spanish language: Spain proposed that the Spanish language becomes the third official language of ISGF. Such a decision would be a modification to the Constitution. Its adoption would then need a 2/3 majority. As this is not achieved, the motion is rejected

8.2 Who pays the participation of officials in World Conferences? Today, the registration fees for conference for the 6 members of the World Committee and the 3 ex-officio are taken charge in the budget of the conference. Australia proposed that it would in the future be taken in charge by the central budget of ISGF. The Conference adopted this proposition. It asked the World Committee to determine the supplementary cost of these expenses for the ISGF budget 2027 and the possible consequences for the fees of 2027.

8.3 Proposers and seconders of motions The Rules of Procedure were amended to state that the delegate of the NSGF which seconds a motion should be *physically present* in the Conference. The motion was approved.

UK raised the question of understanding these two words. The Conference, through a vote, asked the World Committee to be more precise on the meaning of these words when it proposes the rules of procedure for forthcoming conferences.

8.4 Sustainable development

Italy and Norway presented a motion on sustainable development. The Conference accepted it and asked the World Committee to establish a declaration.

The Conference, having noted that the propositions from Malaysia and Saudi Arabia were cancelled, and the candidature of Senegal was not accompanied by a project, decided to postpone the decision for 6 months (15 March 2025) so that Senegal has time to present a project and that other countries might possibly present their candidature.

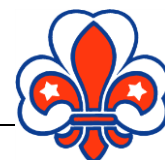
