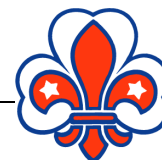


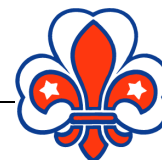

Cooperation and support to Scouting and Guiding in your country	
<p>Liaison has been established with TSAM and BPSM, the two main scouting organisations in Malta. Meetings have been held with both Chief Commissioners. We have joined them in the St. George's Day parade and the Remembrance Day parade. Liaison has also occurred with leaders of 1st Cospicua Scouts and 1st Xghajra scouts to discuss direct local involvement. Attempts have been made to meet with MGG (HQ) and 26th Cospicua Girl Guides. No response so far. This has been given a lower priority pending our community commitments (below).</p>	
Cooperation and support to the community?	
<p>From TSAM and BPSM we learned that prerequisites must be met before liaison with youth members can take place. The same 'safe from harm' measures are assumed to apply for MGG.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Registration of Malta SGF as a Maltese Voluntary Organisation (well underway);2. Each member of Malta SGF must submit to and be approved by the Court of Voluntary Jurisdiction, to receive a decree that the person is a fit and proper person to associate with youths under 18 years. This process takes place after step 1 (above) is completed. This is an obligatory requirement for all members as Malta SGF needs holistic clearance. <p>Malta SGF is preparing a 'Beetle Drive' as a means of promoting adult membership amongst the Maltese community. Likely timeline is Q1 2025.</p> <p>Malta SGF meetings take place monthly, shirts and scarfs worn by all members, with the meeting circulating amongst cafés in the Three Cities area to combine public appearance with community engagement.</p>

From TSAM and BPSM we have also learned that our association with youth members, although permitted, would remain limited until Malta SGF members have completed some basic training. These programmes are voluntary, but highly encouraged:

3. Basic First Aid (Red Cross or St. John’s Ambulance courses);
4. Food hygiene (required for any Malta SGF member to help in kitchens, camp cooking etc.)

Training programmes, costs and timing have been circulated to Malta SGF members. Ideally these programmes would come after steps 1 and 2 above.
